Dear Monseñor Emil Paul Tscherrig:

(Included are various ítems of correspondence for your review.)

It is a pleasure to write you.

One of the enclosed letters is for the congressman Luis Bastera, to whom I was referred by the office of Ms Juliana de Tullio, whose office advised me Mr. Bastera is handling agrocultural matters for the governing party within the Congress.

The others are emails. One is a copy of an email for Monseñor G. Karcher and the other is for the Argentine ambassador in the Vatican, Dr. Jose Cafiero. (I am grateful to be able to send this correspondence to these officers thanks to an Argentine priest who gave me with these addresses. I am sending all this to Mons. Karcher, too.)

TO THE MATTER AT HAND:

Considering the pope has had excellent relations with all local parties here, in Buenos Aires, and since the papal office has even been able to bring discussion to the Palestinian and Israeli conflict, it is the objective of this correspondence the pope's office bring the same will to the conflicting parties here - between the Rural Society (SRA) & the Victory Front (FpV) – so they may make workable, enforceable national-level law to stop the harmful/illegal use of agrochemicals here, in Argentina. These chemicals' bad use is causing untold harm to the vulnerable in our nation.

All of the included correspondence for you here, is self-explanatory, including the Feb. 13, 2014 letter sent to the president of Argentina, Dr. Cristina Fernandez de Kirchner.

It is greatly appreciated that your excellency will forward this letter, and attachments, to the pope.
